About The Workshop

Cultural identity is a complex and multifaceted construct. This training will explore multicultural identity and ways that context creates inherent power dynamics. The clinical alliance includes actual and perceived power that while present, are frequently left unaddressed. This training will encourage us to deepen our therapeutic work by considering specific elements of identity affecting clients, supervisees, and ourselves.

This is a two-part workshop. You must attend both sessions to receive credit.

Objectives

- **Present** a model of multicultural supervision
- **Explore** the relevance of Intersectionality to understanding real or perceived power differentials
- **Define** at least five facets of cultural identity relevant to the clinical environment
- **Identify** at least two barriers and two strengths that influence cultural sensitivity

She received her PhD from the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill where she focused on the development, application, and evaluation of prevention research.
