he 2023 Brody School of Medicine Women's Health Conference, now in its 25th year, enables clinicians to engage in a discussion addressing the most clinically important topics relevant to women's health across the lifespan.

Studies show that women make up to 90 percent of the health care decisions for themselves and their families. The number of women aged 45 and older has increased significantly in the last ten years. In order to meet the health care demands of an aging population that traditionally experiences higher incidences of illnesses, we must work together to raise awareness about health promotion.

This conference is designed to empower healthcare providers to assist women in making informed decisions about health, well-being and personal safety. The agenda is designed to provide camaraderie and instruction for physicians, midwives, nurse practitioners, pharmacists and physician assistants with a broad range of topics relevant to women's health. Faculty of the highest caliber will challenge you to reach out to women – your patients, your colleagues, as well as to professional associations, state leadership, and health care advocacy organizations on the health issues of importance to your community, thereby creating tomorrow's success stories for women's health.

Content of educational objectives will be met through didactic presentations with ample time for questions and answers, as well as informal exchange and networking. A comprehensive online course syllabus is provided to all registrants.

Upon completion of this knowledge-based conference, participants should have a greater understanding of strategies to integrate into practice new developments in the following:

### Sexually Transmitted Diseases: Screening and Management Update

- Review current recommendations for management of herpes simplex virus, hepatitis C, and syphilis

- Identify potential candidates for HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP)
- Review the updated CDC guidelines for initiation and monitoring of patients on PrEP and PEP
- Discuss the current treatment options for PrEP and PEP

## The Benign Breast

- Review basic risk assessment for breast cancer and evaluate the tools required to do so
- Synthesize all breast cancer screening recommendations available for the average risk patient
- Discuss the management of the patient who is at high risk for breast cancer
- Describe the variety of benign breast pathologies that a patient can present with and examine the appropriate management algorithms

## **Trauma-Informed Gynecologic Care**

- Discuss of how experiencing sexual trauma affects physical and mental health and accessing healthcare
- Review pelvic exam appropriateness and guidelines
- Discuss patient-centered approaches to pelvic exams and gynecologic care to reduce risk for trauma and retraumatization

### Why Women Leak Urine and What Can be Done About It?

- Discuss urinary incontinence as a chronic disease
- Describe the three most common types of urinary incontinence in women
- Review the five basic treatment approaches to any pelvic floor problem
- Discuss the mean outcome of a midurethral sling procedure and describe one factor that mitigates this outcome
- Summarize three overactive bladder treatments

### **Pediatric Gynecology**

- Describe common gynecologic problems experienced by pediatric patients
- Review methods of eliciting a pertinent history and performing a focused physical examination that is age appropriate
- Discuss treatment of pediatric gynecologic disorders

#### **Substance Use Disorders and Women's Health**

- Review substance use and addiction in general
- Discuss screening and identification of substance use disorders
- Review commonly used substances with a focus on opioids and available treatment options
- Discuss the need for compassionate, comprehensive care

## **Nutritional Needs After Weight Loss Surgery**

- Discuss preparing the gut and the table for surgery
- Review dietary progression for successful weight loss
- Discuss vitamin and mineral requirements for life
